The Pastor's Corner A Message from Pastor Rubens

My friends,

As I pen these words, my heart is filled with gratitude for the time we have spent together. The journey we have shared has been marked by moments of joy, growth, and mutual encouragement. As I prepare to say farewell, I am reminded of the powerful words from Hebrews 12:1-3:

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him, he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart."

This passage has been a guiding light for me throughout my ministry, and I hope it will continue to be a source of strength and encouragement for you. As we part ways, I want to leave you with a few reflections based on this powerful scripture, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

1. Draw Strength from the Cloud of Witnesses

The lives of those who have gone before us—our ancestors in faith—are a testament to the power of perseverance. Hebrews 11 is filled with stories of men and women who, despite overwhelming challenges, remained steadfast in their faith. They ran their races with perseverance, and now they stand as witnesses, cheering us on in our own journeys.

Reflect on the biographies of faith that surround you—whether they are biblical figures like Abraham, Jacob, and David, or modern-day heroes who have faced persecution and hardship for their beliefs. Let their stories inspire you to keep pressing forward, even when the road is tough. Their lives remind us that we are never alone in this journey of faith.



2. Reflect on Your Own Journey

As you continue to run the race marked out for you, take time to reflect on your own life. What are the things that might be hindering your progress? What sins or distractions are entangling you, preventing you from fully embracing the life God has called you to live?

The word "entangles" suggests being ambushed or encircled. Sometimes, the things we desire—whether they be material possessions, comfort, or even seemingly harmless pleasures—can slowly take control of our lives, leading us away from God. It is crucial to identify these entanglements and, with God's help, cast them aside.

Life is a marathon, not a sprint. It requires endurance, patience, and focus. Like the great French Protestant girl, Marie Durant, who endured 38 years of imprisonment for her faith, we too must resist the temptations to give up when faced with trials. Let us run with perseverance, keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, who is the ultimate example of endurance and faith.

3. Keep Your Eyes on Jesus

Finally, the most important encouragement I can leave you with is this: Fix your eyes on Jesus. He is the pioneer and perfecter of our faith. His life, death, and resurrection are the greatest sources of inspiration we can ever have.

Jesus endured the cross, scorning its shame, because He saw the joy that was set before Him—the joy of reconciling us to God. He faced opposition, pain, and death, yet He remained steadfast in His mission. When you are weary, when you feel like giving up, remember what He endured for you. Let His example give you the strength to continue running your race with perseverance.

In the words of the Scottish preacher Robert Murray M'Cheyne, "For every look at yourself, take ten looks at Christ. He is altogether lovely. Such infinite majesty and yet such meekness and grace, and all for sinners, even the chief."

Farewell, But Not Goodbye



Presbyterian Women Bible Study


