The Pastor's Corner A Message from Pastor Cheryl Raine Is Growth Possible?

Although the temperatures are in the 90's again after a short respite from the heat and one down pour of rain, the fall season has officially begun. Seasons, however subtle they are here in the Inland Empire, remind us that letting go is part of the growth cycle. Deciduous trees begin to lose their leaves in autumn. Flowering plants go dormant. A season of rest makes new growth possible in the spring.

The sabbatical season we all experienced this past summer was a season of letting go. In some ways maybe more so for me than for you. Even so, we all had to let go of some of our expectations and routines. I had to let go of all the responsibilities of daily ministry, including my community board and presbytery responsibilities. I had to be okay with not being in the "know" as they say. You had to be ready to accept that Pastor Rubens would do things differently. We all had to let go in large and small ways to navigate this season of the church.

Letting go is part of God's design, as we learn in Genesis. On the seventh day God rested from all the work that God had done. One of the ten commandments reminds us of this as well, "Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy." God instructs Moses to tell the people, "In the seventh year there shall be a sabbath of complete rest for the land, a sabbath for the Lord." Rest, which causes us to let go of all that is demanding our energy, is part of God's design. Science also confirms our need for rest. Rest gives our bodies and minds time to reset, recharge, and recover. Sleep helps restore our body's energy, repair damaged tissues and muscles, and triggers the release of hormones that help with growth.

And so I ask again, "Is growth possible?" Certainly! The question is what type of growth do we desire for ourselves and for our faith community?


What about your experience of this sabbatical season? What about our collective experience? What has God done in the soul of this church?

Praying with the Gospel of Luke

'What is the *kin-dom* of *God* like?"

How do these metaphors help you understand your role in bringing more fully the kin-dom of God on earth? During the month of October, the morning worship service will be looking at some of the parables found in the Gospel of Luke. Below are two that you are invited explore on your own.

"¹⁸ Jesus said therefore, 'What is the *kin-dom of God* like? And to what should I compare it? ¹⁹ It is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in the garden; it grew and became a tree, and the birds of the air made nests in its branches.' ²⁰ And again Jesus said, 'To what should I compare the *kin-dom of God*? ²¹ It is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened.'" [Luke 13:18-21]

You will notice that I often say, "kin-dom" rather than "kingdom." Removing the "g" takes away the imperial connotation as well as emphasizes our relationship with each other. All of humanity is kin, for we are all God's children. This month I invite you to explore what these parables mean for your own spiritual journey. How is your life like the woman kneading bread with yeast knowing that yeast makes dough rise? How is your life like a mustard seed knowing that the plant grows so large it is able to welcome others? How do these metaphors help you understand your role in bringing more fully the kin-dom of God on earth?

Spend some time with God reflecting on these parables and what they mean for your spiritual journey and our collective spiritual journey as a church. Remember we worship a living God, who is active and present in our daily lives.

Seeking Nominations For Such a Time as This... Are You Called to be an Elder or Deacon?

The Nominating Committee will begin their work soon and elders and deacons are essential to our life and ministry together. Twelve elders along with our pastors comprise the Session, which "exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation." Nine deacons along with our lead pastor comprise the Deacons, which is a ministry of "compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ" for those in need within our congregation and in our local community. Both callings nurture and serve the health and wholeness of our faith community.

Our at large members of the nominating committee for 2024 are Meike Leong, Kristin Rager, and Jerri Rodewald. Our Moderator from Session is Gayle Timilione and our representative from Deacons is Lynn Phelps. Pastor Cheryl is an ex-officio member, which means without vote.

As we continue to navigate our changing world, let us listen for the Spirit's urging to discern who is being called for such a time as this. Serving as an elder or deacon is a commitment to be actively engaged in seeking God's vision for our ministries.

All deacons will have opportunities to take the lead in some aspect of the Deacons' work, which consists currently of visiting, calling, and connecting with members of our congregation, organizing fellowship volunteers, preparing communion elements, acting as liaisons with community organizations, and more. All elders will have the opportunity to be engaged in the work of the session, which is organized into these areas: Spiritual Formation, Outreach, Personnel, Property and Finance.

This sacred work is a labor of love for our faith community, as we live the heart and mind of Christ at the heart of the city. Being the church is an exciting adventure as we seek God's wisdom and trust in the power of the Spirit at work within, which enables us to do far more than we can ask or imagine.



Property and Finance Update



Here are some broad highlights from our financial reporting Year to Date August 31, 2024:

So, what do these numbers mean? Our donations and pledges YTD are less than anticipated by \$3,543.19. The Adjusted NUI happens below the NUI line because the principal on our loan is not considered an expense for accounting purposes, although the principal payment does come out of our checking account. Therefore, at the end of August our income was \$9,718.68 more than our total expenses. Our continued generosity is necessary to help us to be financially strong as the year progresses and our expenses catch up with the anticipated amounts. For example, in the first week in September we paid the previous month's electric bill and our quarterly insurance payment and those two expenses alone were about \$11,000.

As we gather in celebration of our pastor's return from a well-deserved sabbatical, let's remember to continue to be generous with our giving. Let's make this time of renewal a catalyst to make 2024 a successful and positive year both financially and spiritually.

Maintenance and repairs continue throughout the campus with the help of vendors and volunteers. Several minor repairs and plumbing repairs were completed by volunteers on campus.



Session Highlights September 2024




