You might remember that the church received \$20,592 for sabbatical support and I received \$31,883 to help with sabbatical expenses. In June, the group will share their thoughts about *Erasure* (American Fiction), by Percival Everett.



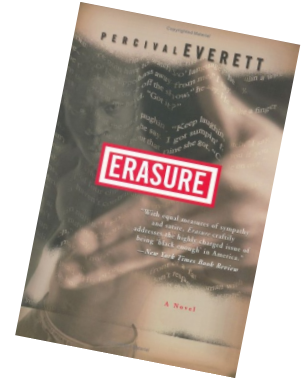

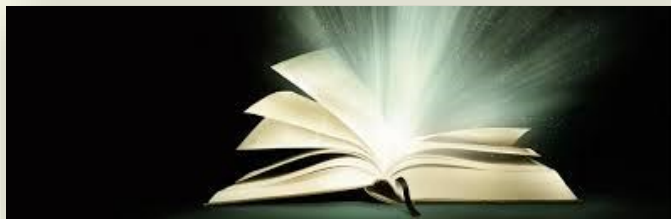

The Family Service Association of Redlands (FSAR) 10th Annual Hunger Walk is scheduled for June 1, 2024, designed to help alleviate food insecurity in our community and bring awareness to this critical issue. With rising inflation, the low-income clients that FSAR serves are increasingly vulnerable to food insecurity and hunger. This 5k walk seeks to raise funds to alleviate this insecurity. On my first day of sabbatical, I want to give back to our community, so join me as we celebrate together the beginning of our sabbatical season!

The 5K walk is a family friendly event. The walk begins and ends at the University of Redlands Memorial Chapel. **Pre-registration deadline for Team Presbyterian is Mother's Day, Tuesday, May 14, 2024.** So, check your calendar and plan to participate as we step up to stop hunger in our community. All proceeds benefit the FSAR's food pantry and breakfast program. In 2023, FSAR served over 16,000 meals, distributed over 1,700 community food boxes, and provided food assistance to over 2,500 families.

Contemplative Corner

Praying with the Gospel of Mark

“If you have ears to hear,
then hear!”

Does the seed of God’s word
flourish and produce thirty
or sixty or a hundredfold?

As we conclude this season of Eastertide this month, I invite you to reflect on the following passage from the Gospel of Mark:

“Again, Jesus began to teach beside the sea. Such a very large crowd gathered around him that he got into a boat on the sea and sat there, while the whole crowd was beside the sea on the land. ² He began to teach them many things in parables, and in his teaching, he said to them: ³ “Listen! A sower went out to sow. ⁴ And as he sowed, some seed fell on a path, and the birds came and ate it up. ⁵ Other seed fell on rocky ground, where it did not have much soil, and it sprang up quickly, since it had no depth of soil. ⁶ And when the sun rose, it was scorched, and since it had no root, it withered away. ⁷ Other seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it yielded no grain. ⁸ Other seed fell into good soil and brought forth grain, growing up and increasing and yielding thirty and sixty and a hundredfold.” ⁹ And Jesus said, “If you have ears to hear, then hear!”

As you move through the month of May, consider what type of soil you might be? Does the seed of God’s word flourish and produce thirty or sixty or a hundredfold? If not, what soil tending may the Spirit need to do in you?

Concrete Work

You may have notice new concrete in the parking area and in the courtyard. The parking lot concrete was necessary to prevent flooding in the basement area underneath the office as well as undermining the building’s foundation. This was the most cost-effective solution to eliminate future damage. The courtyard cement will make way for a future bike rack under the stairs.

Cell Tower

Our contract for the cell tower is being renewed and the income increased because of the construction planned soon. Thankful to P&F Committee that negotiated the increased income given that the work is “additional” and not “replacement.” It helps to have knowledgeable volunteers!

At the end of the first quarter, our total income was more than expected by \$6,714.18. Notice that our donations and pledges, that is our collective giving, was more than anticipated by \$1,327.16. Our expenses year to date are lower than anticipated, resulting in an adjusted net restricted income of \$7,719.22. Our collective generosity is what makes our ministry possible. Thank you for helping us have such a strong financial start to this new year.

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Redlands held its regularly scheduled Stated Session Meeting on Monday evening, April 29, 2024, via a Zoom Meeting, and took the following actions:

- Received the Unaudited Financial Report for the month ending March 31, 2024.

- Approved the selection of the Sabbatical Pastor for FPCR for June, July, August 2024, if the details of the offer can be finalized in the next week.

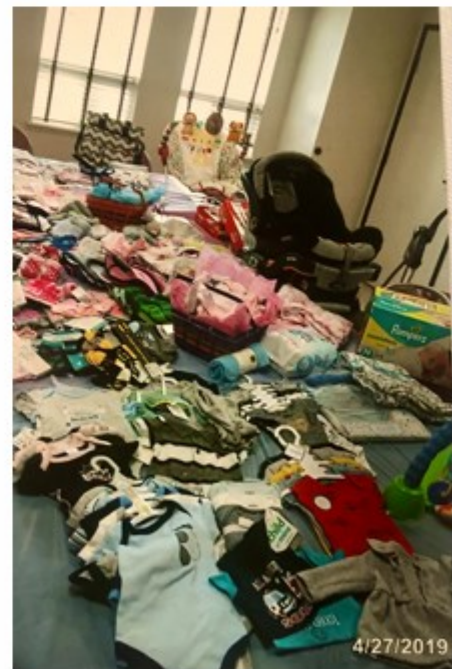
