Faithfulness Amid
Uncertainty

How are you feeling these days? If you are anything like me, maybe a bit uncertain. Fear and dread or celebratory anticipation might be creeping in too. Uncertainty abounds as polls keep showing divided results. None of us knows what the results of our upcoming national election will be or bring forth. None of us knows if the candidates, propositions, and local ballot measures we voted for will win or not. We don't really know much other than our uncertainty. So, what are we to do?

We are to continue to live our faith day in and day out, rooted in the love of God, authentically and intentionally. As the scriptures remind us, "Love God" and "Love Neighbor" and even as Jesus said, "Love your enemies." Love is to be the animating force of our lives. Love is to be our signature witness.

During these final days before the election let us remember that God is with us. No matter what the results are God will be with us. God will be with those who celebrate. God will be with those who grieve. God will be with us no matter what circumstances unfold. The question for us is will we be present to God?



with one another and forgiving one another, and above all cloth ourselves with love?"



As part of my sabbatical season, the Spirit nudged me repeatedly to continue growing my ability to respond to life's situations, rather than react. You might know that our stress (reactive) response is orchestrated by the amygdala, which resides in our reptilian brain, our most primitive cerebral structure. The part of the brain that allows us to think before responding to stimuli is the prefrontal cortex and it is responsible for complex cognitive functions enabling us to consider options before acting or responding to a stimulus.

I learned a long time ago that simply taking the time to take a deep breath when faced with a stimuli helps me engage my prefrontal cortex. Yet, this is the lesson the Spirit nudged me to relearn again and again. It's a lesson that is essential in the uncertainty of our times. Remembering to take this deep breath recalls these words from the psalmist for me, "Be still and know that I am God" [Psalm 46:10]. Here is a meaningful way I discovered to pray this phrase:

Be still and know that I am God (pause and breathe deeply)

Be still and know that I am (pause and breathe deeply)

Be still and know (pause and breathe deeply)

Be still (pause and breathe deeply)

Be (breathe deeply and just be)

This simple prayer practice can help us ground ourselves in the Ground of our being, in the deep and abiding love of God. Faithfulness in uncertainty is possible. Let us listen to the wisdom of God, the One who is our Prince of Peace and wellspring of love.

Praying with the Gospel of Mark

"For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many." This month I invite us all to spend some time reflecting on the request of James and John of Jesus as recorded in the Gospel of Mark. You might remember what they wanted Jesus to grant: "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." I am certain that James and John didn't expect Jesus' response even though they might have anticipated the response of their peers. Jesus uses this opportunity to teach all of them saying,

"You know that among the gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. ⁴³ But it is not so among you; instead, whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. ⁴⁵ For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many."

As the month of November unfolds how might God be calling us to not to be served, but to serve others? How might God be reordering our understanding of what it means to be great? This month read the whole passage Mark 10:35-45 and listen for the ways that the Spirit is nudging your spirit. Share with others what the Spirit has shown you.

PROPERTY AND FINANCE UPDATE



Finances and Property Usage

Here are some broad highlights from our financial reporting Year-to-Date September 30, 2024:

So, what do these numbers mean? Our donations and pledging are \$6,594.28 less than anticipated and our expenses are lower than anticipated at this point in the year. Therefore, the good news is we have an Adjusted NUI that is \$4,939.52 more than our expenses. The Adjusted NUI happens below the NUI line because principal on our loan is not considered an expense for accounting purposes, although the principal payment does come out of our checking account.

Maintenance and repairs continue throughout the campus with the help of vendors and volunteers. Several minor repairs and plumbing repairs were completed by volunteers on campus.

The question was recently asked whether it's possible to give to the church with a credit card, and the answer is YES! The church website has an online giving option.

- Just go to the website at https://www.fpcredlands.org
- At the top right-hand corner click on **Give**
- Then you can select an amount, give to deacon's or the general fund, set up recuring gifts or just one time, and decide how to transfer your gift including by using your credit card.

This is all powered by The Presbyterian Foundation. They do charge a fee for the convenience to our worshipers, but there is even a button to give a little bit more to help the church offset this cost. You will be asked to set up an account so that we can make sure your tax-deductible gift is credited to the right place.

Save the Date—Congregational Meeting, December 1, 2024


